

# **Drinking Water Quality and Compliance** For RESORT VILLAGE OF THODE 2016 Annual Notice to Consumers

## Introduction

The Water Security Agency (WSA) requires that at least once each year waterworks owners provide notification to consumers of the quality of water produced and supplied as well as information on the performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by a Permit to Operate a waterworks. The following is a summary of the Resort Village of Thode water quality and sample submission compliance record for the Jan.1st to Dec.31st 2016 time period. This report was completed on January 17, 2017. Readers should refer to the Agency's Municipal Drinking Water Quality Monitoring Guidelines, November 2002, EPB 202 for more information on minimum sample submission requirements and the meaning of type of sample. Permit requirements for a specific waterworks may require more sampling than outlined in the Agency's monitoring guidelines. A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual is required for water entering the distribution system. Tests are normally performed on a daily basis by the waterworks operator and are to be recorded in operation records. This data includes the number of free chlorine residual tests performed, the overall range of free chlorine residual (highest and lowest recorded values) and the number of tests and percentage of results not meeting the minimum requirement of 0.1 mg/L free chlorine residual. Water is supplied by the City of Saskatoon and is chloraminated so there is rarely a free chlorine residual. The system operates on total chlorine residual.

## Chemical - Health Category

All waterworks serving less than 5000 persons are required to submit water samples for WSA's Chemical Health category once every 2 years. The Chemical Health category includes analysis for arsenic, barium, boron, cadmium, chromium, fluoride, lead, nitrate, selenium and uranium.

Thode is required to test for trihalomethanes because the distribution system was used for raw water. The system will be monitored until the WSA deems it not necessary.

# **General Chemical**

All waterworks serving less than 5000 persons are required to submit water samples for WSA's General Chemical category once every two years if a ground water source and once per three months every second year if a surface water or blended surface/groundwater source. The General Chemical category includes analysis for alkalinity, bicarbonate, calcium, carbonate, chloride, conductivity, hardness (as CaCO<sub>3</sub>), magnesium, sodium, sulphate and total dissolved solids,
